ST. JOHN'S HEAT & AIR FUND

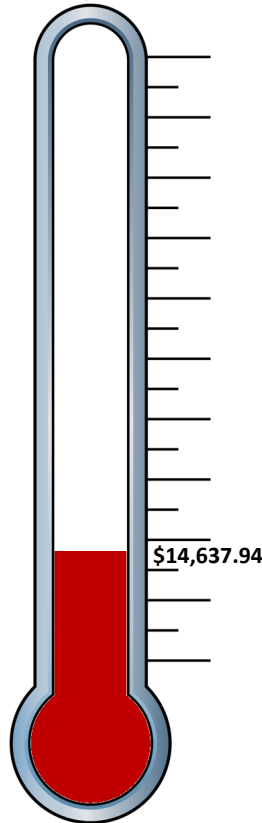
