Rex Barker: Recovering from hip surgery.



St. John's Church Worker Scholarship Corner

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me" (Isaiah 6:8 ESV).

What does it cost to attend Concordia University? Tuition alone averages \$16,000 per term (cuw.edu and concordia.edu). Students prepare to work in the LCMS as teachers, deaconesses, and lay ministers, to name a few possible career choices. Many continue their studies at an LCMS seminary for a pastoral calling. It can be an expensive road to travel.

St. John's has a scholarship fund to assist those who decide to enter Concordia University, no matter which branch, to prepare for a career in full-time church work. While 25% of all funds contributed remains in the fund to finance it, 75% of funds contributed to the St. John's Church Worker Scholarship Fund will be divided equally between applicants from our congregation. Anyone desiring to support our Concordia students is asked to make contributions by August 15. Designate your donation to the fund by writing "St. John's Church Worker Scholarship" in the memo of your check.

Any member of St. John's who plans to attend Concordia University or Seminary is eligible for this funding. Applications are available by going to stjohnsmoore.life/church-home and clicking on the icon for "scholarship application." Applications are due to the committee by August 15. 


