
ST. JOHN'S HEAT & AIR FUND



LWML Inasmuch Project for August: ***“Make a Joyful Noise unto the Lord”***

Beginning this Sunday and continuing through August, LWML requests the congregation's assistance in gathering items for the building of a music wall to be installed on the playground of St. John's Lutheran School. A music wall (see pictures) is a dedicated area of a playground fence on which are mounted various and rather interesting items that children can strike, pluck, or rub to resonate sound and produce rhythms. Items can include pots and pans, wooden spoons, rainsticks, PVC pipes of different lengths, and many other items. LWML asks for donations of the following items for the music wall. This list is not exclusive. If you think of an item that might produce an interesting sound, please contribute it. Monetary donations will be accepted, especially for the larger items. LWML looks forward to assisting the school in erecting the first music wall at St. John's and listening to the joyful music the children will produce. Thank you for your support.

Items needed include: 2 fence panels, 2 wooden pallets, 2 outdoor benches, outdoors pavers (1ft squared), wooden spoons, metal spoons, pots and pans, cheese graters, empty soup cans and tuna cans, metal popcorn and cookie tins, washboards, old music instruments (tambourine, xylophone, chimes, different sized bells, cowbells, maracas, cymbals, triangles), plastic buckets, rain sticks, drum sticks, metal trash can lids




